Literature Link:

Read Mulga Bill's Bicycle by AB 'Banjo' Patterson.

- Read the poem as a class/individually
- Complete some/all attached activities and questions focusing on literacy skills and responding to the poem either as a class or in literacy groups.
- Complete safe/unsafe list as part of bike safety health lesson

Underline any words you don't know the meaning of. Find them in the dictionary and write down the definition.

Underline the descriptions and details of Mulga Bill and the setting of the poem to draw a picture using these descriptors.





This poem uses rhyming couplets (2 lines that rhyme at the end).

'Twas Mulga Bill, from Eaglehawk, that caught the cycling craze; He turned away the good old horse that served him many days

Can you create a short verse or poem about riding your own bike using rhyming couplets?

While reading the poem, find and highlight the following techniques: alliteration, simile, repetition, onomatopoeia.

What do you think **resplendent** means? Talk to your partner then write your answer down. Look it up in the dictionary- were you right?

What does Mulga Bill mean by 'I hate a man that blows.'

Does this fit in with Mulga Bill's character in the poem?

Write a list of words that tell you the poem is very old, words that we don't use anymore.

Mulga Bill thinks he can ride this bike, even though he's never ridden a bike before. Make a text-to self-connection; write about how you learned to ride a bike. What did you have to do to learn? Who taught you?
